Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for Kenowa Hills Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus, or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Kenowa Hills Middle School placed in the 66th percentile on the Top to Bottom List. Kenowa Hills Middle School was not identified as a priority, focus or reward school. Therefore, it falls into the Continuous School Improvement classification.

This year we are beginning two new initiatives that will help increase our status on the Top to Bottom list. The first is beginning a new performance based program K-8. The new initiative is labeled as Journey to Excellence and our staff and community are excited about the new opportunities this program allows students. Secondly, our district is providing chromebooks at a 1-to-1 ratio for each of our 6-12th grade students. This will provide much needed technology for our students as they prepare for their future schooling and movement into the workforce.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL – Kenowa Hills Middle School assigns students to its school based on district geographic boundaries. The school also participates in the Kent Intermediate School District schools of choice program, the State of Michigan Section 105c schools of choice program, and Section 6 student transfer process.

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2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN – Kenowa Hills Middle School participates in the Michigan Department of Education’s continuous improvement process. The building has a representative stakeholder group responsible for various school improvement tasks throughout the school year. 3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL – there are no specialized schools within Kenowa Hills Middle School. However, the building offers supplemental services for students who qualify for additional support and assistance.
4. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE’S MODEL – Kenowa Hills Middle School is in the process of transitioning to the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). The CCSS are a set of national standards that aim to allow for more in-depth learning and a focus on skills and competencies demanded in the 21st Century. In this time of transition, learning targets are either aligned to Michigan’s Grade Level Content Expectations or the CCSS. Copies of grade level’s or department’s curriculum are available on our district website or in the building’s main office.
5. 6. NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES – During the 2011-2012 school year, Kenowa Hills Middle School’s fall parent-teacher conferences had 502 students represented by a parent/guardian (68% participation rate). During the 2012-2013 school year, Kenowa Hills Middle School’s fall parent-teacher conferences had 517 students represented by a parent/guardian (72.5% participation rate).

We are very proud of the efforts being made to improve the learning for each and every student at Kenowa Hills Middle School. Our community continues to play a vital role in the success of our school. We look forward to building upon the success we have had to impact student learning for all.
