Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) that provides valuable information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for Central Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Cherie Horner (building principal) for assistance. The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting our district's website at www.khps.org. You may also receive a hard copy from the office by contacting your building.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus, or Priority. A reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Central Elementary did not receive one of these labels.

We also need to report additional information by law. Copies of grade level curriculum are available on our district website at www.khps.org. You may also receive a hard copy of a specific grade level's curriculum from the school office. Our school improvement plan involves all staff members continually working on providing a learning environment that allows for high levels of learning for every student. We use various data sources to drive instruction that affects student learning positively. Copies of our school improvement plan are also available on our webpage or by request from the school office. Parent involvement is essential to the success of our school and student learning. In the 2013-2014 school year, 97% of our parents attended conferences.

Some of the key challenges for our school include increasing the percentage of students proficient in math by third grade and keeping them proficient through 4th and 5th grades. Another challenge is to stress science concepts to increase achievement levels while maintaining the focus on reading and math. We also need to address performance gaps within sub groups of our student population.

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Central Elementary's key initiatives to overcome these challenges and close persistent gaps are the continued focused effort to guarantee a viable authentic curriculum to all students and address all students' needs with a multi-tiered structure of support.

The Teacher Quality Data Report indicates that 0% of our teachers have an emergency certification. This percentage reflects teachers that are updating their qualifications by adding a new area they are qualified to teach, or are in the process of renewing their certificate. All teachers at Central Elementary are highly qualified and hold current certifications to teach our students.

We are very proud of staff and community efforts to cultivate and graduate every student at Central Elementary. Our community continues to play a vital role in the success of our school. As the principal at Central Elementary, I will be committed to help build on the successes we have achieved and strive to help this building reach to new levels of success in the future. Central Elementary has a strong desire to create high levels of learning for every student.
